Year 3 visited the Natural History Museum on Monday to learn about volcanoes. Thank you to the parents who came along to help out!



In **Year 4** the children have been learning about how sound travels. They have also started their class reader for this half term - Journey to Jo'burg by Beverley Naidoo. Year 5 finished up their topic from last half term by visiting a community allotment. They have also been learning about the planets. This half term their class reader is The Boy in the Tower by Polly Ho Yen.



In **Year 2**, the children have been exploring the grounds of our school and thinking about different habitats and what might live there. In PSHE, they have been finding out about water safety.

In **Year 1**, the children have been learning about different animal classes and sorting animals based on their features. They have also been writing fantastic fact files about tigers.

In **Reception**, they have been finding out about minibeast facts and using their phonetics to write about them in their own nonfiction books! If they have not mentioned it already, you could ask what they know about a praying mantis!

Year 6 has been planning and writing persuasive speeches about an aspect of the environment that they care about. This was a great opportunity for them to immerse themselves in a topic they feel passionate about, from deforestation to poaching!
